



Amy Sherlock is a widow and a victim of California's adult-use cannabis licensing. In December 2015, her loving husband and the father of their 2 children, Michael "Biker" Sherlock, purportedly committed suicide after having acquired not 1 but 2 of the highly sought off after Conditional Use Permits (CUPs) to engage in the lawful sale of licensed cannabis in the City and County of San Diego.

Originally believing the official version that Biker had died of a self-inflicted gunshot wound, it wasn't until 2020 that Amy was presented with evidence that there were suspicious activities associated with his death which required a closer look into those partners and investors who stood to benefit from his elimination and those CUPs he had acquired being transferred into their names.

That realization that Biker did not likely die of a suicide led to her determined effort to expose the cause of death and those who had an interest in acquiring these licenses is where this story begins. As can be found in her website, Justice4Amy.org there has been extensive discovery and case filings in state and federal courts which name defendants who she alleges has contributed to the theft of those CUPs and the death of her husband.

Her path to justice has been littered with judicial obstacles, set up by wealthy defendants, their lawyers and those within the government who have added to her distress by ignoring disclosure laws and saddling her with anti-SLAPP judgments for having the temerity to name those, that evidence supports, had a means and a motive to see Biker eliminated.

Amy's story is one of justice denied. While foundationally it speaks to the evolving adult-use cannabis industry it is about how our civil rights can be abridged if you stand in opposition to those who use their power, their money and their influence and political connections to deprive those who seek a seat at the table. Whatever that table represents. It is through her vigilance that represents a threat to those subversive attempts to deprive those who seek these opportunities we believe that the rule of law will ultimately be upheld and they will be denied.
